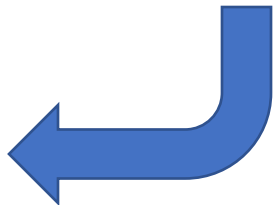

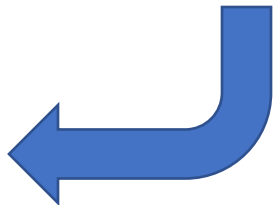
Koala Facts – 2 point Question

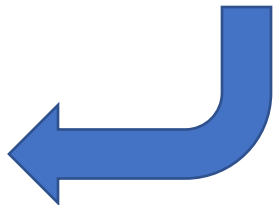

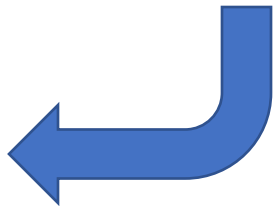

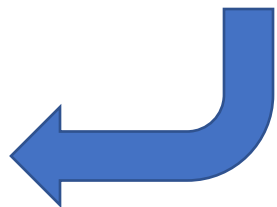

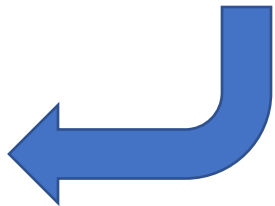

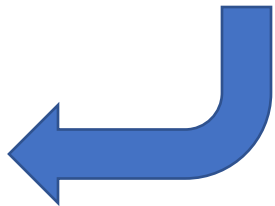

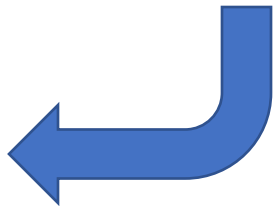

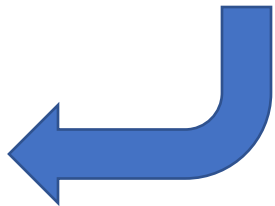

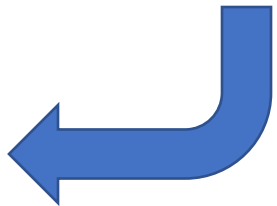

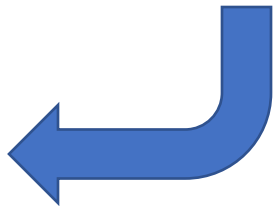

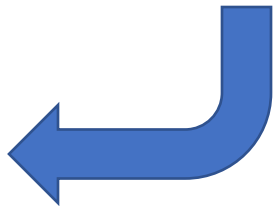

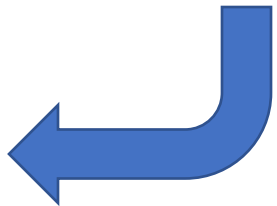

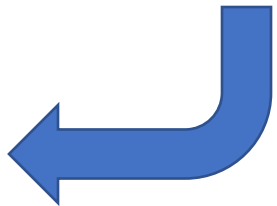

Sugar Glider



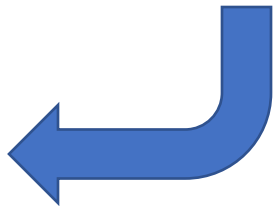

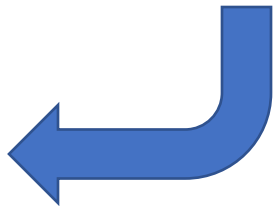

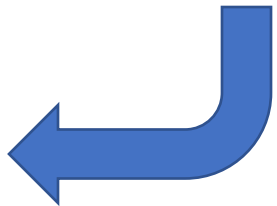

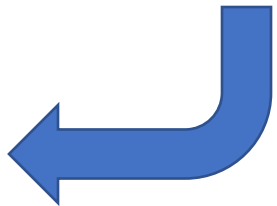
