

Primate and Cat Building

The new Primate and Cat Building of the Cleveland Metroparks Zoo opened to the public on Saturday, June 24, 1978. Capital expenditure funds for the construction of this building, which cost \$3.7 million, came from the Cleveland Metroparks System. Additional funds, required for custom interior work and landscaping of individual animal exhibits, will be provided by the Cleveland Zoological Society, the business community and individual donors.

There are 52 individual animal exhibit areas, all designed for easy viewing by the public, and for the creature comforts and well-being of the animals which inhabit them. All exhibits are glass-fronted with overhead skylights providing natural daylight for the animals. Artificial illumination will be required only on unusually dark days.

Simulated rockwork, trees, waterfalls, pools and flowing streams of water will enhance the animal displays. Interior exhibit decor is designed to obscure walls, doorways, water containers and drains.

See-through exhibits have either extensive interior landscaping as a background, or in some areas, exterior trees, shrubs, and flowers, as well as natural skyline, serve as a backdrop for the live animals. A wide variety of greenery showcases the individual animals; from tall palm trees to medium-sized shrubs to small ferns, a literal forest of plantings creates a very pleasant outdoorlike atmosphere within the building.

The largest animal displays are those for the gorillas, chimpanzees, gibbons, colobus monkeys, and orang-utans. The area for gibbons is 37' x 13' x 18' in height; that is the largest single habitat in the building. In the large displays, huge simulated trees with widespread branches provide a natural playground for the apes and monkeys. Wild grapevines, acquired from local woodlands, are suspended in a number of habitats. Gibbons, chimpanzees and most monkey species love to swing on limbs or vines and the grapevines will furnish the medium for those animals to show off their gymnastic abilities.

Near the center of the building is an elevated level of baboon and monkey exhibits with ramps at either end for visitor entrance and exit. On this level, visitors may view baboons and monkeys in close proximity, or, looking in the opposite direction, visitors may admire the gorillas, chimpanzees, a number of different kinds of monkeys and big cats. Jaguars, leopards, and pumas have raised rock platforms, scratching logs, and interior habitat decor designed to give the animals comfortable vantage points, sleeping pads, and pleasant surroundings.

A special "Creatures of the Night" rotunda provides for the display of nocturnal animals such as phalangers, palm civets, sugar gliders, fruit bats, aardvark, rock hyraxes, and lesser anteaters. Bright lights will be turned on during nighttime hours so that the night-active animals will think it's daytime, and sleep; during visitor hours, animal habitats will be illuminated with red light which is insensitive to nocturnal animals' eyes. The animals, thinking it is night, are active when zoo visitors are viewing them. This is a classic example of "fooling Mother Nature."

A number of intermediate-sized habitats (10' x 12', 12' x 14', etc.) house mammals that are neither primates nor cats, but are classified as "small mammals." Included in this group are the giant anteater, hyenas, and the world's largest

rodent, the capybara from South America.

The entire building is zoned for heating and cooling purposes, with a specific zone having its own thermostatic control. Thus, one area of the building may be warmer or cooler than another area, depending upon the temperature requirements of the animals in any given zone. There is also a separate thermostatic control for the visitor viewing area.

In several habitats where primates are displayed, particularly those of the gorillas, chimpanzees, and orang-utan, fresh water taps will be operated by the animals themselves as they push buttons to turn the water on; release of the buttons turns off the water. This procedure serves a dual purpose: it gives the animal something to do, and lessens the need for an animal keeper to continually monitor the water supply and furnish fresh water at all times.


Sanitation within each habitat is accomplished with a minimum of effort and time; sewer drains in animal living areas lead to high pressure flushing systems.

Carpeting on the floors for pedestrian traffic, and acoustical tile in the ceiling reduce the noise level significantly.

Many safety features have been built into the building. Shift doors, locking bars, holding cages, tempered laminated glass, and welded stainless steel mesh have all been utilized to the best possible

advantage for the safety of keepers and other zoo personnel working with the animals in the building.

Although the new building appears to be isolated from the rest of the zoo's animal exhibits, Cleveland Metroparks director-secretary Harold Schick states, "The Primate and Cat Building is the first phase of a major development in that area of the zoo. Slated for construction over the next two to three year period are an elevated deck walk with upper and lower plazas northeast of the new building, a visitor orientation shelter, a food service unit, a zoo tour train stop, expansion of the upper parking area, and a number of exciting animal exhibits, including a wolf woods, cheetah run, and avian flight

cage."

Schick continued, "This development plan will provide continuity between the upper and lower areas of the zoo.

"The top priority in this program was to move the animals from the obsolete Ape and Cat Building, which was subject to periodic flooding. When the new Primate and Cat Building was planned, the Army Corps of Engineers flood control program was only in the talking stages. There was no guarantee that Big Creek would be moved to alleviate the flooding problem in the zoo; consequently, the new building was built on a site where flooding would never be a problem. Further development to connect that building with the rest of the zoo would logically follow in that general area."

General contractor for construction of the building was R. S. Ursprung; Architect was Ernst Payer & Associates; Interior Green Corp. was landscape contractor; Don Thomas of Thomas & Co. was contractor for the customized habitat rockwork and fiberglass molded trees.

Participating in the dedication ceremonies of the new facility were: Mr. G. Stanley Mottershead, President of the Cleveland Metroparks System Board of Park Commissioners; Mr. Harold Schick, Director-Secretary of Cleveland Metroparks System; Dr. Leonard J. Goss, Director of the Cleveland Metroparks Zoo; Mr. William A. Mattie, President of the Cleveland Zoological Society; Mr. Lee C. Howley, Vice-President of Cleveland Metroparks System Board of Park Commissioners; and Mr. Robert Teater, Director of the Ohio Department of Natural Resources.

Mr. Teater, assisted by "Jackie", a Cleveland Metroparks Zoo chimpanzee, cut the ribbon to officially open the zoo's newest building.

The Primate and Cat Building is the first new animal exhibit building at the zoo since 1956 when the Pachyderm Building, which houses elephants, giraffes, and hippopotamuses, was opened. The newest addition to the zoo replaces the old Ape and Cat Building which was built in 1909, and had long since become time-worn and obsolete.





An Interpretive Naturalist views the Zoo

By Donald Altemus, Resident Naturalist, Cleveland Metroparks Zoo The most frequent question I ask of people who come to the zoo is "What is your favorite animal?" The answer I get most frequently is "Monkeys!" A comedian of former years, by the name of Ed Wynn used to open his act by saying, "Monkeys is the craziest people!" What these people are really saying when they state that they prefer monkeys is that "people are their favorite animals" and, more precisely, they themselves are the most favorite.

In my 11 months as resident naturalist at the Metroparks Zoo I have observed that almost everybody comes to the zoo to see themselves. The animal world is full of diversity but we all have a common goal-survival. We find many more similarities in observing animals than we find differences. Whenever we see something that we have in common with the animal we are observing, our attention is riveted. As an interpretive naturalist my job is to point out these similarities to the general public. There are many mechanisms and strategies used by different animals to get at the same common goals-food, water, shelter and a successful future for the next generation. A close examination of the animals will often show us how this is achieved.


Through the past year I have conducted walks, evening programs, seminars, workshops and public campfires on the zoo grounds to better acquaint people with the many possible ways that one can look at animals. One walk was conducted with the sole (pardon the expression) purpose of looking at feet. The diversity was great but when you looked closer and analyzed, practically all feet are basically alike. All the parts are there, but in modified form to fit the needs of the animal in his particular environment. Hopefully the people went home and took a good analytical look at their own feet.

The land on which the zoo operates also has a number of interesting aspects to it. There is a surprising amount of undeveloped portions for a naturalist to explore. We have held wildflower hikes, bird walks and even conducted a work-

shop on the wide variety of trees to be found here. Great-horned Owls have nested in the big oak trees on the hill above the Big Creek flood plain. I'm sure they are taking advantage of the rodent population that takes advantage of the leftovers that all zoos provide. A variety of wild ducks drop into our waterfowl pond to mix with the zoo collection. Not too long ago we were visited by a migrating Hooded Merganser that stayed for a while, feeding on our abundant minnow population. You can almost set your watch each morning from the visit of a Belted Kingfisher who also freeloads on our minnows. There are about 30 different species of wild birds nesting on the zoo grounds. During migration the trees are sometimes alive with brilliantly colored warblers.

My work puts me in touch with a large number of school children both as a tour guide and in the capacity of a speaker giving small animal programs. Hopefully they will see enough of interest to go home and drag their parents back with them. We would like them to think more of the zoo than just a place to buy cotton candy and see "lions and tigers and bears." There are approximately 1,100 animals at the zoo and many times that many ways to look at them.

As part of the interpretive department of the Cleveland Metropark system I am part of a much larger program of natureoriented activities that go on in the extensive park system. Three other interpretive centers provide year round activities for the public. A full schedule of winter activities is already planned and in print. As part of this program the zoo is joining the other centers in holding winter hikes with a naturalist every Sunday afternoon during the months of January and February. Many other interpretive programs are scheduled at the zoo and will be listed in the Emerald Necklace which is the official publication of the Cleveland Metroparks. Zoo-Potpourri

Eighth Annual Reptile Fair

Because of its tremendous popularity in preceding years, the Zoo's Annual Reptile Fair was once again staged in the long hall of the Pachyderm Building. This year's Fair was the eighth consecutive one which began in 1970 as the result of many inquiries concerning the public exhibition of reptiles at the Zoo.

The educational display of the Zoo's limited reptile collection (not open to the public) from the Administration-Education Center was exhibited from July 29 through August 6. About 40 reptiles plus 1 tarantula and 1 giant African frog joined approximately 80 other exhibit specimens displayed by local amateur herpetologists, most of whom are members of the Northern Ohio Association of herpetologists.

The Zoo's reptiles included the giant snakes (Burmese, Reticulated, and African Pythons, and Boa Constrictors) and a varied group of smaller snakes (rat snakes, king snakes, racers, gopher snakes and garter snakes). Also exhibited were an American Alligator, Common Caiman, a Bengal and Malayan Two-Banded Monitor (lizards) 4 different species of turtles (painted, spotted, slider and snapping), plus the frog and tarantulas.

NOAH members Jim and Randy Tracy, exhibited many exotic species of non-venomous reptiles as well as a special showcase display of poisonous snakes in the entrance lobby of the Pachyderm Building.

The public has shown great interest in reptiles and the Zoo has not had a reptile building for the visiting public since the flood of January, 1959, which drowned the few hundred reptiles kept in the basement of the old Ape and Cat Building.

Although there are no definite plans yet for a new Reptile House, future development of the Zoo will include a major exhibit building to include these fascinating animals.

Special Musical Programs Sponsored by Local Radio Stations

On Tuesday, July 25, 1978, WMMS-FM sponsored a concert featuring nationally acclaimed folk singer Alex Bevan. The concert was staged on the grassy mall area west of the Sea Lion pool and was attended by about 1700 persons.

On Sunday, August 20, 1978, Radio WZZP-FM in cooperation with Pirate's Cove In-the-Flats, hosted a concert performed by "Flatbush." This popular local group donated their talents to help purchase a male aardvark from the Cincinnati Zoo. About 1200 enthusiastic persons attended the 7 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. program.

Several weeks prior to the concert, a "Name the Aardvark" contest was held. The winning name, "Cardshark" was selected by the audience which voted en masse during one of the breaks between sets.



Zippity Zoo

In the usual tradition of the evening, Zippity Zoo featured many varied forms of entertainment ranging from an old-fashioned organ grinder with his monkey, to roving musical groups, a calliope, bagpiper, and live animals, including a cockatoo, caiman, and an 11-foot Burmese Python named "Samantha."

Guests were so enthusiastic about the progressive cocktails, salad bar, dinner, and dancing event that many arrived a half-hour earlier than the announced 6 p.m. starting time.

Cocktails were served at the Children's Farm, Monkey Island, and in the new Primate and Cat Building which was being showcased that evening prior to its official public opening on June 24.

A variety of salads was offered at the salad bar adjacent to Monkey Island. Grilled steak was the entree for the dinner which was served in the huge dinner tent located on the grassy mall area opposite Monkey Island.

Tour Trains moved guests from one location to another so that everyone had the opportunity to visit animal favorites as well as the refreshment oases scattered about the Zoo.

After-dinner dancing music was provided by Bob Berry and his orchestra. Co-chairladies of the Zippity Zoo Committee were Mrs. Richard H. Bole and Mrs. Herbert C. Neal.

Proceeds from the party will be used to cover the cost of interior decorations for the gorilla and chimpanzee habitats of the Primate and Cat Building.

A Docent is a Very Important Zoo Species

What is a zoo docent? A docent is a person who volunteers his or her time and efforts to provide public services to visitors in the zoo or to provide educational and informational services in behalf of the zoo in outside areas. These services may be as a tour guide for groups of school classes, senior citizens, scouts, church groups, social groups, etc., or as small animal program interpreters outside the zoo. Zoo docents have also volunteered as monitors for the handling of animals by the public at the Children's Farm and as information booth attendants answering a broad spectrum of questions concerning zoo animals and facilities.

The current corps of zoo docents is comprised of about 40 men and women who are eager to give of their time and efforts to further the cause of education, information, and recreation at the zoo.

A group of some 20 new docents were recruited during 1978. Most of these were brought into the volunteer ranks in March when they were indoctrinated in an intensive training course conducted by the public service director. The need for these volunteers was great; many requests for tour guides were previously turned down due to a lack of daytime volunteers. The months of April, May, and June are a particularly busy time when many hundreds of school classes take advantage of nice weather to take field trips. This spring the docents were able to accommodate the majority of requests for guided tours. The educational advantages of a personally guided tour by a zoo "expert" are readily recognized.

In other areas of service, docents volunteer their time to staff zoo booths at the Home and Flower Show and the Sportsmen's Show.

During the three weekends following Thanksgiving, docents sell and serve hot coffee, tea, and cocoa, and baked goods at the zoo's Wade Hall Gift Shop. Docents also make handmade "pet gifts"—catnip toys for cats, dog biscuit wreaths, and suet and seed feeders for birds. Proceeds go to the docent treasury

which is used to help the zoo in various ways.

Zoo Flood Control Project to Begin in 1979

After suffering through many Big Creek floods for more than three decades, the Cleveland Metroparks Zoo will finally get relief as the Army Corps of Engineers announced that the long awaited flood control project will be undertaken on June 1, 1979, and is expected to be completed in 1981.

The existing Baltimore & Ohio Railroad tracks and right of way will be moved and a new channel for Big Creek (which now flows through the heart of the Zoo) will be

excavated. The new creek channel will prevent any future flooding of the Zoo. Past floods have been responsible for many thousands of dollars worth of damage to buildings, fences, and other zoo facilities. In January, 1959, a severe flood wiped out the Zoo's reptile exhibits which were housed in the basement of the old Ape and Cat Building.

The \$7 million dollar project will enable the zoo to utilize much of the land between the Fulton Road bridge and eastern boundary of the Zoo which now lies in the flood plain.

Children's Farm Expansion Program Initiated

A major expansion of the Children's Farm has begun with the expected completion date slated for May, 1979.

Included in the development project are a new refreshment facility, comfort station, petting and feeding area, turtle pond, raccoon tree, skunk display and an exhibit building with keeper's quarters and storage area.

Funding for the construction costs which will total \$175,393.25 will be provided as follows:

Cleveland Metroparks System \$53,923.25

The Women's Committee of the Cleveland Zoological Society \$60,000.00 Ohio Department of Natural Resources \$61,470.00

R. A. Klinger is the general contractor for the expansion project.

In Memoriam

The Cleveland Zoological Society is saddened by the loss of three of its Trustees. The Cleveland community will greatly miss these three men who devoted a great deal of time and energy to the development of the Cleveland Metroparks Zoo.

John S. Pyke

John S. Pyke, 73, died Sunday, May 14, 1978. Mr. Pyke had been a member of the Zoological Society for several years and a vice president on the executive board. He had also been a member of the Cleveland Metroparks System's Board of Park Commissioners from 1964-1975, serving as president in 1971, 1972 and 1974.

Mr. Pyke was a partner in Jones, Day from 1948 until he retired in 1973. He joined the law firm in 1945 and specialized in business and corporate law.

He was graduated from Ohio Wesleyan University with a Phi Beta Kappa key in 1927 and in 1930 received his law degree and the order of the Coif from Western Reserve University School of Law.

Mr. Pyke was a fellow of the American and Ohio State Bar Foundations, and a member of the Ohio Parks and Recreation Association, National Parks and Recreation Association, the Greater Cleveland Neighborhood Centers Association and Cleveland, Ohio and American Bar Associations.

Surviving are his wife, Annabelle; son, John S. Jr.; daughter, Judith Tate and three grandchildren. His first wife, Elma, died in 1963.

Mark C. Schinnerer

Dr. Mark C. Schinnerer, 79, superintendent of the Cleveland Public Schools from 1947 to 1961, died October 27 at St. Augustine Manor after several years' illness.

Dr. Schinnerer had been a trustee of the Cleveland Zoological Society since 1957, the year the Society was first organized.

Since leaving the Cleveland schools, he had been a vice president of Shaker Savings Association and also served as an educational consultant at different times to the New York State Department of Education, the U.S. Office of Education, and the Los Angeles Board of Education. In 1963 he was elected to the Ohio House of Representatives from the 49th District and served three terms.

After graduating from Indiana State Teachers College in 1920 he was a math teacher, coach and assistant principal at Rockville (Ind.) High School in 1923. He earned a master's degree from Columbia University and a doctorate from Western Reserve University. Oberlin College gave him a honorary doctorate.

Dr. Schinnerer had been a grand jury foreman, past vice president of the Cleveland Safety Council, past president of the City Club, and served on the executive committee of the Cuyahoga County Republican Party.

He served on the board of trustees of Hiram College, Forest City Hospital, Cleveland Natural Science Museum, Lakewood Hospital, Cleveland Mental Health Association, Cleveland YMCA, International Student Program, and the advisory boards of the Martha Holden Jennings Foundation and the Boy Scouts of America.

Surviving are his wife; daughter, Greta Hobinson and two grandchildren.

Alfred I. Soltz

Alfred I. Soltz, 79, lawyer and real estate developer died July 29, 1978, at his home in Gates Mills after several years of illness.

Mr. Soltz had been a trustee of the Zoological Society since 1964.

He was a former chairman of the board of the Cuyahoga Metropolitan Housing Authority and of the Associated Motor Inns. He was the owner of Stouffer's Somerset Inn and other motels and hotels, and developer of shopping centers in northern Ohio.

Mr. Soltz was a graduate of Ohio State University, and received his law degree from the University of Cincinnati Law School in 1921.

He was a member of the American Jewish Committee, the Ohio and Cleveland Bar Associations and the Florida Coast Guard Auxiliary. He was a past trustee of Mount Sinai Hospital, Montefiore Home for the Aged, and the Cleveland Jewish Community Federation. He was a past president of Fairmount Temple and the Oakwood Club, and a trustee of the Cleveland Jewish News. He was a director of Cook United Inc. and a past director of Interfaith Housing Corp.

He is survived by his wife, Margery; son, Robert L.; daughter, Nancy S. Hyams; six grandchildren and a sister.

Veteran Zoo Employees Retire

Three Zoo employees with a combined service total of 79 years retired during 1978.

Joe Chery

Joseph P. Chery, General Superintendent of the Zoo, retired on June 29, 1978, after serving the Cleveland Metroparks Zoo for more than 40 years.

Joe began his service at the Zoo on August 10, 1937, and performed every type of zoo job possible during his long tenure here.

A retirement party was given in Joe's honor the week before he said his final goodbye to his fellow staff members and operations employees.

A native of Omaha, Nebraska, Joe moved to Cleveland during the 1920's. Just prior to joining the Zoo he was employed as a bartender at a Denison Avenue tavern opposite Brookside Park. He indicated at the time that he changed jobs, that it is easier to work with animals than with drunks.

Joe noted that he was not going to sit around and do nothing in his retirement. Fishing, golf, and travel were high on his list of activities to be pursued after he left the Zoo.

Ladd Chluda






